

NATIONAL EXTERNAL DIPLOMA PROGRAM



General Information

The National External Diploma Program (NEDP) is a competency-based high school diploma program for individuals 18 years of age and older. The program evaluates the reading, writing, math, and workforce readiness skills of participants in life and work contexts by initiating an applied performance assessment system to determine high school level skills of adults. Participants are required to demonstrate their high school level abilities by applying their skills in simulated academic, workplace, and life contexts.

Registration and Cost

Attend one of the information sessions which are held at the Adult Learning Center, Bldg. #4, 14800 Joplin Road, Manassas, VA 20112 (Independent Hill). No one will be admitted after the scheduled start time. Allow approximately 2 hours for the information session and assessment. Sessions will be held on the following dates and times:

Tuition fees are payable by cash, cashier's check, or money order. **NO PERSONAL CHECKS.** All fees are non-refundable. Program offerings are contingent on funding and sufficient enrollment.

Non-residents of Prince William County, City of Manassas, and City of Manassas Park will be required to pay additional tuition fees.

Completion time varies with each individual, averaging from six months to a year. Graduates of the National External Diploma Program are adults who are self-directed and mature, practical and highly skilled, and interested in confidentiality and recognition of their life-long learning.

The NEDP awards a diploma that is issued by the local school board and is accepted by colleges. However, colleges may require that adults meet other admissions standards.

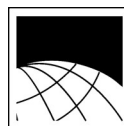
